**Objective:** Understand the range of resources available through libraries, professional associations, and teacher-focused web sites to support your fieldwork and research questions, and how to access and search them.

**Locate and prepare instructional aids and lesson plans. Investigate classroom management, behavior management, lesson plan design, critical and creative thinking, differentiated instruction, and student assessment.**

**---Look to: articles, books, education departments, government, OERs, web.**

### Library Resources

- *ERIC (Education Resources Information Center)*. Abstracts and citations to educational-related literature from articles, conferences, meetings, government documents, theses, dissertations, reports, AV, directories, books and more. There are currently over 1.4 million records in the database. Coverage is from 1966 - present.
- *Education Full Text*. Full-text education database covering over 350 periodicals; in-depth coverage of special education (over 50 journals). Coverage is from 1996-present.
- *Educator's Reference Complete*. More than 1,100 periodicals, U.S. Department of Education reports, and reference sources. Covers education from preschool to college, and all education specialties. Coverage is from 1980-present.
- *Middle Search Plus*. More than 140 popular, middle school magazines, as well as biographies (over 84,000), historical essays, primary source documents (over 105,000) and a School Image Collection of photos, maps and flags.
- *Professional Development Collection*. Nearly 520 education journals, including more than 350 peer-reviewed titles, as well as 200 educational reports (e.g., Electronic Education Report).

- *What Works Clearinghouse*. Part of the Institute of Education Sciences of the U.S. Department of Education.
