Course Objectives

Upper Division Writing Course

- Upper division writing courses at UM require the inclusion of, among other points, the following information literacy learning outcomes:
 - Find, evaluate, analyze, and synthesize information effectively from diverse sources
 - Follow the conventions of citation, documentation, and formal presentation appropriate to that discipline

Term Paper

- Requires a minimum of six references.
- Find readings to supplement class material and provide you with additional information about each person's research, theoretical approach, or specific contribution to the field.

- What do you already know about the scholar, theoretical approach, or psychological phenomena?
 - Where will you look for additional background information?
 - What search terms will you use to find the information?
- What key questions will you pose hypothetically to each of your scholars?
 - Where will you look for information to answer the questions?
 - What search terms will you use to represent each of your questions?

Books & Bibliographies

Locate background information, find sources to track down.

- Textbooks, Reserve items
- Dictionaries, Encyclopedias, & Handbooks, for example:
 - Biographical Dictionary of Psychology (2002)
 - Encyclopedia of Psychology (2000)
 - ▶ Encyclopedia of the History of Psychological Theories (2012)
- ▶ 150.9 call number area, 5th level of the library, for general history of psychology books
- Titles by and about the scholar, theoretical approach, and or psychological phenomena of your study
 - Full text online books via ebrary, EBSCO & PsycBOOKS databases



Library Catalog

Locate books (print and electronic), media, archival materials, and more.

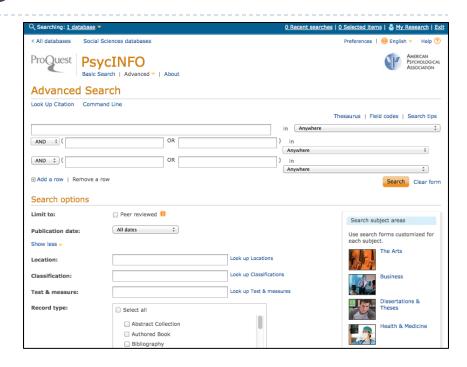

Index *PsycINFO*

Locate abstracts and citations to scholarly sources

- Includes abstracts & citations to over 1,800 professional journals, chapters, books, reports, theses and dissertations in the psychological, social, behavioral, and health sciences. There are over 3.3 million records in the database.
- within the database consists of more than 8,200 standard and cross-referenced terms derived from the print *Thesaurus of Psychological Index Terms*, 11th edition (2007).
- Cited references data available from 2001 forward.





Full Text

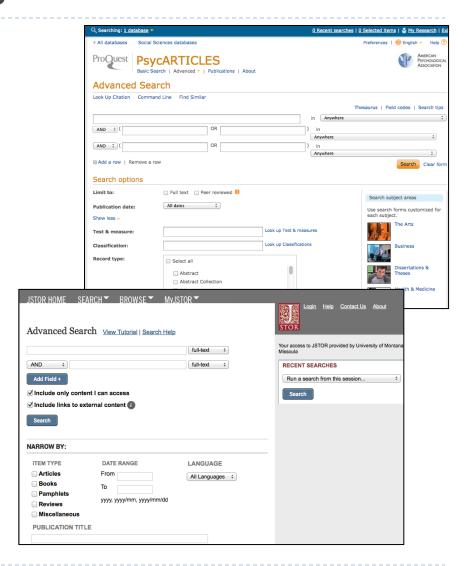
Locate full text journal articles.

PsycArticles

Articles from the over 70 journals published by APA, the APA Educational Publishing Foundation, the Canadian Psychological Association, and Hogrefe & Huber.

JSTOR

Articles covering the arts, humanities, social sciences, business, and the sciences. Includes 318 Psychology journals.





You search and find too many sources.

- Narrow your search terms, use Thesaurus or Subject terms
- Add another search term focused on an aspect of your topic with Boolean operator "and"
- Exclude concepts using Boolean operator "not"
- Focus on a specific research methodology or instrument (e.g., quantitative, Wechsler intelligence scale)
- Limit your results:
 - by publication date,
 - publication type (e.g., journal article),
 - peer-reviewed/refereed, and/or
 - language, etc.



You search and can not find enough sources.

- Use one source to find others trace the citation forwards (who has cited the article since it was published), and backwards (who does the article reference)
- Try different keywords and Thesaurus or Subject terms
- Broaden your search terms using the Boolean operator "or"
- Try searching a different discipline-specific database
- Remove any limits you have set (e.g., publication date, peer review, journal)
- Use a wildcard character to capture variant word endings (e.g., educat*)
- Use variant spellings (e.g., behavior or behaviour)

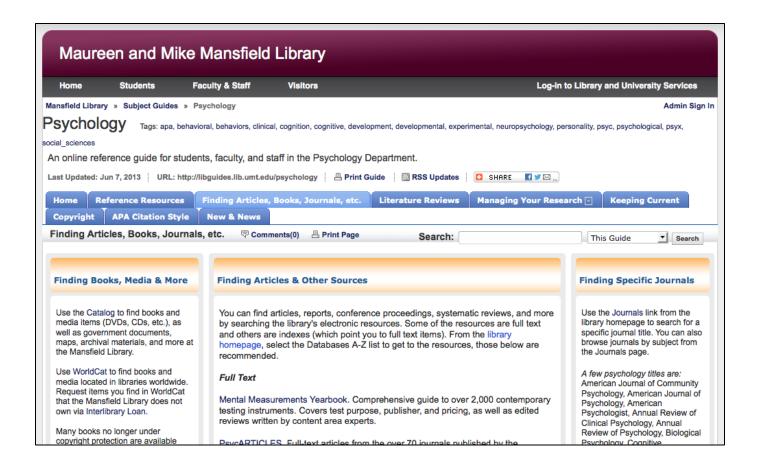


You search and find sources that are not available at the Mansfield Library.
